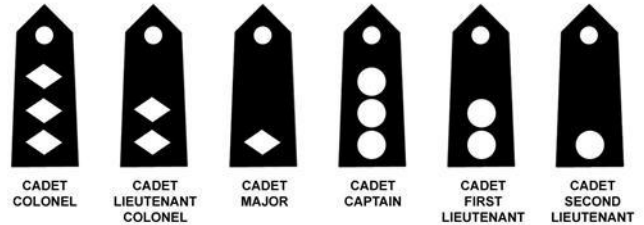

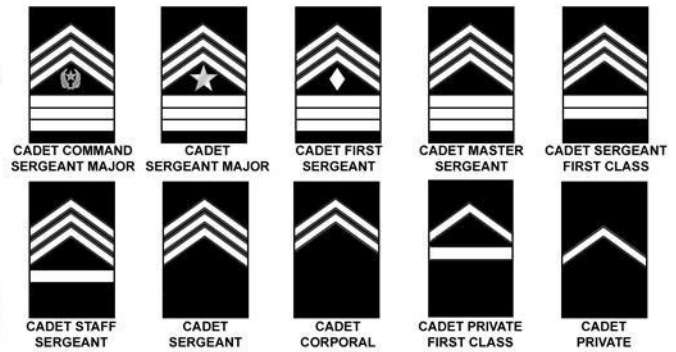


Cadet Joey Skinner playing a flash card game with Courtland student Mark Williams.

Jr. Law Cadet Program

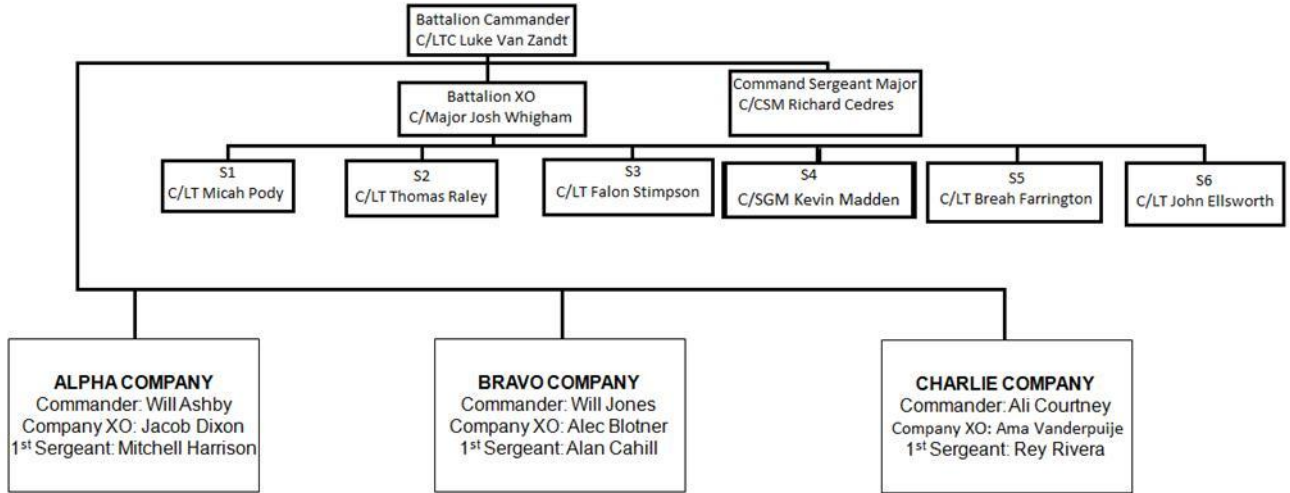
